Working Environment

Work is primarily carried out indoors, but project work in the field will be required. Therefore, there can be exposure to extreme weather along with exposure to dust, noise, mud, water, smoke, and bacteria.

Responsibilities:

Environmental Inspector Responsibilities list:

Under the supervision of the Project Manager, assisting with the management of operations at KBL's own soil treatment facilities and partner facilities by:

- Performing regular inspections of the facility;
- Tracking incoming waste to ensure accuracy for annual reporting;
- Completing treatment campaigns of soil and water as required; collecting confirmatory samples;
- Ensuring waste materials are documented and processed in a manner which allows for tracking individual sources from acceptance to treatment to removal;
- Annual compliance sampling and reporting as directed;
- Other duties as assigned.

- Low Flow Groundwater Sampling Equipment (Peristaltic pumps, bladder pumps).

- Specialized knowledge in the areas of environmental site assessment and remediation, including sampling of soil, water and air, interpretation of results and reporting;

- Strong communication skills, both written and oral; ability to interact with various types of stakeholders, regulators and first nations;
- Standing for long periods of time, lifting objects up to 100 lbs, performing repetitive motions, or completing physically demanding tasks
