

# Chief Isaac Mechanical doubles its workshop capacity with \$1.5M investment from the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency

Chief Isaac Mechanical, the light- and heavy-duty mechanic shop owned and operated by the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Citizens' development corporation in Dawson City, Yukon, has secured \$1.5M investment from the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency (CanNor) to double its workshop capacity.

Construction will begin in Spring 2022 to lay the pad and start building the 460 square metre expansion to the facility on the Callison Industrial Area outside Dawson City. The construction will be completed, and the new facility open by late 2022. The expansion will allow Chief Isaac Mechanical to service heavy duty vehicles in a heated shop and to expand its team of mechanics.

Frances Aitken, Industrial Manager for Chief Isaac said: "The team at Chief Isaac Mechanical are proud of the quality of their work and customer service. CanNor's \$1.5m vote of confidence in them is a huge boost. This allows us to expand our services for heavy and light duty customers and grow our team of professional technicians. As a 100% First Nation owned business all our profits go back to the local community and CanNor's investment increases our ability and capacity to do that."
